

Cervid Gestation Table-196 days

Whitetail deer are known and named for their long whitetail that is raised when alarmed. Antlers begin to grow in late spring and are covered with velvet until late summer to early fall. Whitetail females are seasonally polyestrous animals, entering the rut with the declining photoperiod in the fall. They are similar to many other cervid with a breeding season in the fall normally beginning in late October. Most females mature around 1 or 2 years of age and generally can reproduce about 6 months after they mature. Whitetail are similar to many other deer species but they typically have twins at birth whereas many other species have singles.
